NCC/HRSA Meeting Update	 Mike Watson announced that the NCC/ACMG is receiving a sole source grant for the Newborn Screening Translational Resource Network (NBSTRN) from NICHD. It will create a nationwide co-hort of NBS outcomes for lifetime tracking in all states willing to participate. A planning meeting is scheduled for April 2009, but the invitees have not yet been announced. The RCCs requested that they be kept informed of progress and meeting dates. Lori Williamson has requested details from Judith Benkendorf regarding the April meeting. Legislation—Two bills have recently passed Congress and were signed by the President. a. Newborn Screening Save Lives Act was passed and is waiting for appropriations. b.
